



Newspaper Origami Seed Planters

1 Start with 1 half sheet of newspaper. Fold it in half top to bottom. Fold it in half again top to bottom. Then fold in half again this time left to right.





2 Now open the fold you just made back up to form an "L".

Make sure to hold the folded edge away from you.



3 Using both hands, grab the two sides of the top corner of your "L" and pull outwards and down.



Your right hand (with its flap) should line up with the bottom corner of your original "L".



the top should look like the diagram on the left.

Make two creases along the diagonals by flattening your paper. When you're done


4 Flip your paper over and repeat the last step on the other side. This time your "L" should look more like an upside down "T" and when you pull on the top two flaps, each hand should match up with a corner of the bottom triangle.





After creased, the paper should look like the diagram on the left.


5 Take the bottom left corner of the top triangle and fold it to the the center crease. Repeat on the right.




Now take the fold you just made and again fold it toward the center crease. Repeat on the right side.




Your paper should look like the above diagram.





6 Now flip your paper over again and repeat the previous step. Your paper should now look like the right diagram.




7 With the point facing down separate the two sides to form a box. Next, you need to staple the folds together so it does not come apart. Make sure to secure both the right and left flap to the piece behind it.



8 Once you have secured both sides, flatten out the bottom by poking out the corners from the inside, and you're done!



Finished Product



9 Fill with soil and your seeds of choice. Dampen soil with water and watch your seeds grow! When plants are 1-2 inches tall, you can plant the whole thing, paper and all!
