Zero Waste of Resources

King County is working toward a goal of Zero Waste by 2030, meaning that materials of value, whether for reuse, resale, or recycling, will not be put in the garbage and end up in the landfill.

This does not mean that there will not be any garbage. Studies done at the King County Cedar Hills Regional Landfill (where our garbage goes) show that over 70% of the "stuff" we throw away each year could be recycled, composted, or reused.

How can you help?

Almost 40% of food grown in the U.S. is never consumed.

Here is how you can help keep food out of the garbage:



Buy what you need.



PLAN Before you shop, check your fridge, freezer and cupboards. Plan meals with items you already have. Shop with a list and use restraint to avoid buying more than you need.

STORE

Store food properly to make it last longer.

Eat what you buy.



EAT Cook and eat the meals that you planned. Practice use-it-up methods, freeze it, or give it away to friends and family. Get creative. Use up overripe fruit in a smoothie, or wilted veggies in a soup. Stale bread can become breadcrumbs or croutons.

Compost the rest.



COMPOST

Put unused food scraps into your vard+food cart.

RECYCLING



Place clean, dry, and loose items (as listed below) in your **blue** recycling cart. Collected every other week.

Metal

ALUMINUM & TIN CANS

Place lids in can, crimp the can shut. Labels ok.

SCRAP METAL

Small, non-working metal appliances, pots, tools, etc. Limit 2' x 2' x 2', 35lbs; no wood, plastic, or rubber attachments; no sharp metal.

Glass

BOTTLES & JARS

Only bottles and jars (no other types or shapes). All colors. Labels OK.

Paper and Cardboard

CLEAN & DRY

INCLUDES: paperback books, catalogs, magazines, dry food boxes (remove plastic liner), non-foil wrapping paper. Flatten all boxes (do not tie up); Maximum size 3'x3'.

Plastic

BOTTLES, JUGS & TUBS

Ignore the numbers, recycle plastics by shape!

Used Cooking Oil

RESIDENTIAL DISPOSAL



Do not pour cooking oil down the drain as it can cause blockages. Instead, carefully pour cooled cooking oil into a watertight container, seal it and place it in the garbage. For larger amounts of used cooking oil, use cat litter or another absorbent material like sawdust, flour or sand to absorb the oil, place in a sealable bag and dispose of the bag in your garbage.

RECYCLING TIPS

No plastic bags, garbage bags or "recycling" bags allowed.



Paper cartons (milk or juice) are not accepted and should be placed in the garbage.



Empty and rinse out all food residue. Labels do not need to be removed.



Ignore the number on plastics— Look at the SHAPE.



Recycle plastic only if it is a bottle, jug or tub. No containers that held hazardous material.

Extra recycling: If you often generate extra recycle, please call WM to increase your cart to the next size.

YARD+FOOD WASTE



These go in your **green** yard+food waste cart. Collected weekly.



INCLUDES: Plants, grass clippings and weeds. (Remove plastic pots, twine, gardening tape and twist ties).

Leaves, tree branches and roots. (4' or shorter & less than 4" in diameter).

All debris must fit in cart with lid closed.



Food Waste & Leftovers

All food including meat, bones, fish and cheese.





No utensils, cups, or dishes even if labeled "compostable" or "biodegradable".

YARD+FOOD TIPS

Gather food scraps from your kitchen in:

- Paper grocery bag
- Reusable container
- Newspaper
- Certified compostable bag (Look for this symbol)



Empty contents of reusable container into the yard+food waste cart frequently and rinse out.

NO SHREDDED PAPER, TO-GO CONTAINERS, MILK CARTONS, OR PET WASTE.

Composting for the Holidays



Remove candles from Jack-o-lanterns



Remove twine



Un-flocked, undecorated whole trees cut to less than six feet in height are acceptable.

No shiny, plastic lined or coated materials. Greasy food soiled paper is ok.









Extra Yard Waste



(collected for a charge)

If you often generate extra yard waste, additional yard waste carts are offered at a discounted rate. For occasional extra yard waste, place next to yard+food waste cart in any of the following:

- Heavy brown paper yard bags (available at hardware stores)
- 32-gallon cans labeled "Yard Waste" (65 lb. limit)
- Bundles tied with natural twine (4'x2' limit)

NO FOOD WASTE IN EXTRA YARD WASTE CONTAINERS

NO EXTRA YARD WASTE IN PLASTIC BAGS.



Bag these and put them in your **grey** garbage cart. Collected weekly.

Non-Recyclable Plastic

INCLUDES: Polystyrene foam products, plastic plates and cups, caps and lids, plastic utensils, empty prescription vials, diapers, chip bags and candy wrappers.



Non-Recyclable Glass

INCLUDES: Incandescent light bulbs (Fluorescent light bulbs & tubes need special disposable)









Non-Recyclable Paper

INCLUDES: Disposable wipes, hardcover books, foil wrapping paper, coated (shiny) paper plates, facial tissue, shredded paper.











Non-Recyclable Metal

INCLUDES: Caps, lids, empty latex paint cans (dry out paint, remove lids, hardened paint okay) and sharp or greasy metal.













Other Garbage

INCLUDES: Bagged cold ashes,

vacuum bag and dust; bagged

other products.

GARBAGE TIPS

Numbers do not matter. If a plastic item is not a bottle, jug or tub, it belongs in the garbage.

Paper cartons (milk + juice) are not accepted in the recycle program and should be placed in the garbage.



Double bag pet waste, vacuum dust, sawdust and cold ashes.



DO NOT put liquids, yard waste, hazardous waste or recycling in the garbage.

Any extra garbage (including lid open or anything outside of the cart) will incur an extra charge.

LATEX PAINT

Latex paint cans may be placed in the garbage if paint is solidified. To solidify, mix in cat litter, shredded paper, sawdust, or paint hardener. Once paint is dry, leave the lid off and place in your garbage. Alternatively, PaintCare™ can recycle your paint.



On-Call Bulky Item Collection

Auburn residential customers can receive a free bulky collection of up to four items, one time per year.

Acceptable Bulky Items

Appliances: Refrigerator and freezer, stove, cook top or hood range, clothes washer, clothes dryer, hot water heater, dishwasher, trash compactor, window or floor air conditioner, dehumidifier, water cooler, small furnace.

Furniture: Sofa couch (no sleeper sofas), sectional sofa, love seat, futon, recliners, lounge chair, ottoman, mattress and box spring, bed frame and rails, dresser, bookcase, desk, end table or nightstand set, coffee table, dining table and chairs, small entertainment center, filing cabinet.

Power Yard Equipment: Remove all oil, fuels and batteries. Electric, motorized or non-motorized: Trimmer, weed whacker, lawn mower, table saw, chop saw, generator, snow blower, power washer.

Exercise and Recreation Equipment: Treadmill, circuit trainer, rowing machine, exercise bike, elliptical, bicycle, basketball hoop and base, metal swing set.

Miscellaneous: BBQ's, small rug, hot tub cover, small ladder, large plastic play toy and outdoor kiddie pool, wheelbarrow, microwave, small outdoor (pop-up) canopies, vacuum cleaner, child car seat or stroller, artificial Christmas Tree.

Weather Delays

If weather and/or road conditions delay collection, up to twice the regular amount of garbage, recycling and yard+food waste will be collected at no charge on your next regularly scheduled collection day and collection week. Please note that recycling is collected every two weeks. Credits will not be issued for delays due to inclement weather.

Holiday Schedule

Collection service is provided on all holidays except Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day.

If your collection day falls on or after these holidays, your scheduled collection will be delayed one day that week. For example, if your regular collection day is Friday, holiday collection will take place on Saturday.

Cart Placement Tips



- Place carts at curb or alley by 7am
- 2' apart with lids opening toward street
- 3' from cars, trees, mailboxes, fences and utility boxes
- Please remove carts within 24 hours after collection
- Please move basketball hoops out of the street on collection day
- Avoid parking on the street in cul-de-sacs on collection day
