RECYCLE



Recycle the following in your recycling cart or dumpster.

👍 **NEWSPAPERS:**

Any newspapers and the advertising inserts that come with them. Place in a paper bag to prevent contamination.

👍 **CANS:**

Aluminum, tin and steel cans, with lids (e.g. soup cans, pet food cans, coffee cans, etc.) Also, empty paint and aerosol cans. All CRV containers.

No cookware, auto parts, or scrap metal.

👍 **PLASTICS:**

Clear or colored plastic soda bottles. Plastic milk and water jugs, juice bottles, shampoo, conditioner, empty motor oil containers, laundry soap bottles and all CRV containers.

No other plastics, kitchenware, Styrofoam[®]™, plastic bags or plastic toys.

👍 **GLASS:**

Clear or colored soda, water or juice bottles, food jars, beer, wine or liquor bottles. All CRV containers.

No window glass, dishes, glass cups or Pyrex[®].

👍 **PAPER:**

Magazines, catalogs, mail (window envelopes o.k.), colored paper, cereal and other food boxes and phone books.

No soiled paper products or waxed paper.

👍 **CARDBOARD:**

Flatten and place loose in the cart or dumpster.

No pizza boxes or waxed cardboard.



Turn Your Trash into Cash; Recycle Bottles and Cans!

Thanks to the California Beverage Container Recycling and Litter Reduction Act, you can receive 5 cents for containers less than 24 ounces, and 10 cents for containers 24 ounces or larger. All you have to do is take your bottles and cans to a recycling center to claim the CRV amount, and watch that change add up!

Thanks to the CRV cash incentive, more than 200 billion

aluminum, glass, and plastic beverage containers have been recycled since the program began in 1987. Just last year, Californians bought 21.9 billion carbonated and noncarbonated drinks in aluminum, glass, plastic and bi-metal containers. More than 16.1 billion of those containers were recycled, saving natural resources, conserving energy and extending the life of our landfills. Imagine what we'll accomplish if we recycle the other 5.8 billion!

The Importance of Recycling

Recycling is important, but just how big of a difference can it make? Did you know:

- Last year, Americans trashed over 180 BILLION tons of recyclable materials like newspapers and aluminum cans. That equals \$6.4 billion dollars, 540 billion cubic yards of landfill space and \$12 billion in lost energy!
- The EPA estimates 66 percent of the materials we trash every day could be recycled. Only approximately 25 percent actually is being recycled.

- Every year, we waste one billion trees by throwing away our newspapers and other paper products.
- Recycling 35 percent of our trash would reduce global warming emissions equal to taking 36 million cars off the road.

New Safe Needle Disposal Program

Santa Clarita residents now have a free and easy way to dispose of "sharps," or needles and lancets from the convenience of their own home.

"Sharps" disposal kits can be picked up from the Waste Management/Blue Barrel yard at 25772 Springbrook Road, Saugus, CA 91350 from 8-5, Monday through Friday. Your first kit is free, the second is available at a \$5.00 co-pay. Seniors may receive 2 kits free, with any additional kits available for a \$5.00 co-pay. Limit one at a time.

Fill up your kit at your own convenience. When it is full, simply mail it back using the pre-paid postage label that is included in the kit. Please make sure to sign the form that is included on the front pocket of your kit. Waste Management will ensure your sharps are disposed of safely.

"Many don't realize that throwing your

needles away in the trash is illegal," explains Sandra Pursley, Waste Management Community Relations Manager. "Improperly disposed syringes, hypodermic needles and other SHARPS can pose a serious hazard to our families and community."

Surveys show that more than 3 billion needles and syringes used by self-injectors end up in trash or recycling containers, or are flushed down toilets every year. This improper disposal puts sanitation workers and the public at risk of needle sticks and serious infections.

Make sure you dispose of your "sharps" responsibly, and pick up your free kit today.

Does Your Building Recycle?

Did you know that on average, about 60% of all the garbage we throw away is recyclable? Recycling is an easy way to go green, so if your building doesn't have a recycling program, you're missing out on an easy opportunity to conserve natural resources, save valuable landfill space and prevent global warming.

Free Drop-Offs at WM Yard

The illegal dumping of waste can pose a significant public health, environmental, and safety issue to the City of Santa Clarita. Furniture, mattresses, other large items and trash are routinely dumped on sidewalks and alleys this not only looks bad, but it is costly for public works employees to clean up.

The good news is there's no need to dump illegally, because Waste Management offers free bulky item drop-offs at the Waste Management/ Blue Barrel Yard at 25772 Springbrook Road, Saugus, CA 91350 from 8-5, Monday through Friday.

Acceptable items for drop off include extra trash and recycling, electronic waste, tires, yard clippings, and bulky items like furniture, mattresses and

appliances.

You can also drop off and donate your gently used clothing at the new Salvation Army drop box located at the Waste

Management/ Blue Barrel Yard. Donating your clothing is a simple, convenient and charitable way to reduce the amount of waste you send to the landfill, all while helping your fellow community members in need.
