FOOD SCRAP TIPS

Gather food scraps from your kitchen in:

- Paper grocery bag
 - Reusable container
 - Newspaper
 - Compostable bags
- kingcounty.gov/depts/dnrp/solid-waste/garbage-recycling/compost-right

Extra Yard Waste



(collected for a charge)

If you often generate extra yard waste, additional carts are offered at a discount rate for those with large yards or seasonal volume needs.

For occasional extra yard waste, place next to yard+food waste cart in any of the following:

- Heavy brown paper yard bags (available at hardware stores)
- 32-gallon cans labeled "Yard Waste" (65 lb. limit)
- Bundles tied with natural twine (4'x2' limit)

Storm Recovery

Following a city-designated storm event, up to 96 gallons of loose or bagged (prepared as an extra set out) storm debris may be accepted with regular yard+food waste service at no additional charge.
