

CURBSIDE RECYCLING GUIDE

Wood Village residents can mix all paper, cardboard, metal and plastic bottles in their recycling carts. Only glass needs to be recycled separately.



Mixed Recycling

All recyclables must be clean, empty and loose when they go into the cart.



Plastic Bottles & Containers



Food, Beverage & Aerosol Cans



Paper



Flattened Cardboard & Paperboard



Aluminum Foil & Scrap Metal



KEEP OUT of Your Recycling Container

- NO plastic bags
- NO bath tissue, paper towels or coated paper
- NO plastic lids or straws
- NO pizza boxes or food soiled cardboard
- NO hazardous waste
- NO styrofoam



Glass Recycling – in the Bin

Glass must be recycled separately in your glass-recycling bin. Put in glass bin. Mix all colors. Labels ok.

Light bulbs, ceramics, broken glass, glassware, window panes and lids are **not accepted**.

Motor Oil Accepted Curbside

Put in a clear plastic bottle with a screw on lid. Do not mix with other liquids. Place next to recycling cart.

YARD DEBRIS GUIDELINES

The following items go in your yard debris cart:



Yard Trimmings

Branches • Houseplants • Garden vegetation
Grass and leaves • Weeds and prunings
Undecorated holiday trees

Extra Yard Debris


Put extra trimmings that don't fit in your cart in one of these:

- 32-gallon cans with handles + lids (60lb limit) Fill loosely so cans empty easily. Label "Yard Debris".
- Kraft paper yard bags
- Bundle extra branches (4x2x2 ft. limit)
- DO NOT USE PLASTIC BAGS



KEEP OUT of Yard Debris

- Food
- Diapers
- Pet Waste/Litter
- Plastic Bags
- Metal
- Cooking Oils
- Glass
- Hoses
- Tarps
- Plastic Twine



As the leaves fall on your yard and driveway, please do not place them in the street. The City provides a **Free Leaf Drop Off** area for Wood Village residents at the Donald L. Robertson Park, Oct 31 – Dec 31.

Beyond Curbside Recycling

WM offers mail-in collection programs for batteries, electronics, sharps, toner cartridges and compact fluorescent light bulbs.

THINK OUTSIDE THE CART

REDUCE AND REUSE BEFORE YOU RECYCLE. Waste prevention is our biggest opportunity to reduce the consumption of natural resources.



PREVENT FOOD WASTE – BUY ONLY WHAT YOU NEED
When grocery shopping, be thoughtful. Make a list and buy only what you need to minimize any food waste. Visit wmnorthwest.com for more food waste reduction tips.



BUY NOTHING
Instead of buying items you will use infrequently, consider borrowing or renting. Borrow from a neighbor or social media site.



SHARE, SWAP OR SELL
Sell items you no longer want and find bargains at consignment shops, garage sales, thrift stores, online exchanges and auctions.



CHOOSE TO REUSE
Use reusable mugs, water bottles, utensils and bags. Store these in your car or at your desk so you will always be prepared.

Before you buy, use or discard an item, ask yourself:
REDUCE: Can I get this item used or with less packaging?
REUSE: Can I, or someone else, use this item again?
RECYCLE: Can I recycle this item after I use it?
BUY RECYCLED: Can I buy this item with recycled content?

COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Wood Village residents receive weekly garbage, recycling and yard debris service.

Please follow these guidelines to ensure collection.

Please place containers at the curb by **6 am**

- Three (3) feet apart with lids opening toward street
- At least three (3) feet from cars, trees, mailboxes
- Wheels as close to the road as possible
- Please remove containers as soon as possible after collection
- Do not overstuff your carts. All materials must fall freely into the truck

Maximum allowable weights:

- 20-gallon cart – 35 lbs
- 35-gallon cart – 60 lbs
- 60-gallon cart – 100 lbs
- 90-gallon cart – 145 lbs



Hazardous Waste

Do not dispose of hazardous waste products (i.e. paint, fluorescent light bulbs, pesticides, gasoline, solvents, etc.) in your garbage. For information on where to dispose of hazardous waste, please visit www.oregonmetro.gov.

Holiday Service

Garbage, recycling and yard debris are collected on all holidays except Christmas (Dec. 25) and New Year's Day (Jan. 1). If your collection day falls on or after Christmas or New Year's Day, collection will be one day later that week, with Friday customers being serviced on Saturday.
